Lent, Even in The Pandemic?

The season of Lent is intended to gracefully challenge us to examine our life and maybe even help us to discern how our COVID-19 time of quarantine and isolation can both separate us and draw us closer to God's love. Confronted by needy crowds and angry Pharisees, even Jesus needs to retreat and be alone so that he might reconnect with God the Father and do the mission and ministry before him. Time and again, Jesus went to a solitary place to fast, pray and be in fellowship with God. Jesus practiced his isolated reflection times, not because of sin, selfishness, or a pandemic like us, but because he understood that taking time to be alone and closer to God means a more full and deeper relationship. He knew that prayer, reading scripture, and reflection are critical if we want to live a faithful and full life. Even in the midst of a pandemic, we are called to examine what separates and what inspires us to know and share God's love.

Our Lenten time of reflection starts with Ash Wednesday on February 17th this

year. Florissant Presbyterian Church will be having an Ash Wednesday service that evening at 7:00. Even during the challenges of the pandemic and social struggles, we are invited to examine our brokenness, our limitations, and our sin. It will be a time of worship to remember God's steadfast love is for us. I hope that each of you will join us in person, in our parking lot on our FM transmitter, or at home online throughout lent. Even in a pandemic, Lent can be an appropriate and wonderful time for all of us to grow closer in God's love.

broadcast to the parking lot through the FM receiver. Masks will be required, and social distancing maintained plus all St Louis County guidelines will be followed.

Candy continues meeting with other Clerks of Session via ZOOM.

Treasurer's Report: Financials have been posted.

Task Force: The next Sack supper giveaway continues the 2nd and 4th Thursday every month starting at 4:30. Help for set up is at 4:00 pm. Mobile Market will continue based on availability from St Louis Area Food Bank on the 3rd Saturday of each month. Leftovers will be taken to TEAM. Fresh produce and frozen food may be added to the non-perishables. Help needed starting at 7:30 am.

The Task Force is focusing on "connecting to the community".

Christian Education: Pastor Sean will begin an adult Sunday school class on "Opportunities of Anxiety (Gospel of St Mark)" by Dr Chang on the first Sunday of February. Lynn Bohler suggested children's books from the FPC library be given away or create a book exchange.

Congregation Care continues cards, calls, and visits to FPC members. A Calling Chain will begin in 2021 to all members of FPC.

Church Life – Per Capita for 2021 remains at \$32.

At the called presbytery meeting in January the resignation of Reverend Dr. Craig Howard was accepted and the relationship between Dr. Howard and the Presbytery of Giddings-Lovejoy dissolved. Presbytery Leader Search Committee (PLSC) was elected to begin working immediately. It also approved the call to The Rev Elizabeth Kanerva to serve as Associate Presbytery Leader.
