From the Pastor

Our Food Truck Sunday is a safe opportunity to gather around two of my favorite things: food and fellowship. It is a chance for reconnecting, refreshing and renewing our church family with a Homecoming setting, while enjoying the space of our church yard, pavilion and Harmon Hall. In welcoming the One Dish Wonders Food Truck to join us after church on September 26 our plan is that we will all safely enjoy a lunch together and, more importantly, our hope is that this time of worship and fellowship can help to reduce the loneliness and separation we've all experienced during the Covid-19 pandemic isolation.

For well over a year now, every 2nd and 4th Thursday, our church's Grab-n-Go meal typically hands out well over 120 hot meals. The Grab-n-Go sack meals' hotdogs are awesome, but I've discovered that some people are not just coming for the food. They're coming for connections in the community, relationships in their neighborhood, and a sense of God's Spirit in the mission. Although people primarily come for the meal, we are also growing connections that let us start getting to better know ourselves and our neighbors. We all have a need for both physical and spiritual nourishment. We all have a need to feel known, to feel important, and we all have a need to feel connected. It is partially this recognition that inspired us to initiate the new One Dish Wonder Food Truck event.

As we expand the vision of our food mission by enjoying the many different dishes of the food-truck, we're also growing in our personal knowledge of how to open our hearts, lives, and the church doors. We're making inter personal progress in welcoming others and connecting with people in our neighborhood and community. Inviting the food truck helps us potentially better address our own and our community's relational and spiritual needs.

There's something about the concept of gathering together, enjoying a meal and then sharing fellowship and conversations with others that makes people feel like family. With all of the loneliness and separation we've all experienced during the pandemic isolation, you are invited to join us at safe distances for a special Sunday of worship, fellowship and food.
